INTRODUCTION

Cycling road was on the programme of the Games of the I Olympiad in Athens in 1896. It was absent from the next three editions, and returned at the Games of the V Olympiad in Stockholm in 1912. Women's road cycling made its first appearance at the Games of the XXIII Olympiad in Los Angeles in 1984.

KEY STAGES

Entry	1894: At the Paris Congress held in June, the wish to have cycling as part of the Olympic programme was expressed by the Congress participants.
Women's inclusion	1980: At the 83 rd IOC Session held in Moscow in July and August, it was decided to add a women's road cycling event to the programme of the Games of the XXIII Olympiad in Los Angeles in 1984.

1896: 1 event (men's)

1912-1980: 2 events (men's)

1984-1992: 3 events (2 men's, 1 women's)

1996-2020: 4 events (2 men's, 2 women's)
